The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School is pleased to announce the return of the Advanced Contract Law Course for 2017. The course is listed under ATRRS as 5F-F103 for 28 – 31 August 2017 and will be held at The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School in Charlottesville, Virginia. This is mid-level education in advanced and specialized acquisition topics. This year's course will focus on contract formation issues for the field attorney. The classes will discuss Acquisition Planning for field attorneys, Contracting Methods and Contract Types, Procurement Fraud, Special Categories of Contracts, Socioeconomic Policies, Bid Protests and Debriefings, as well as discussions with industry and the GAO.

This course is by INVITATION ONLY, and is intended for U.S. Government attorneys in the current role of non-supervisory contract law attorneys with two to five years contract law experience and have attended the Contract Attorney's Course or equivalent training. Applications from all federal agencies meeting this criteria are welcome, though due to the limited class size, priority will be given to Department of Defense attorneys. All prospective students must complete the course application for approval or disapproval no later than 14 July 2017. Approved applicants will be notified for completion of ATRRS enrollment by 19 July 2017.

The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School and the Contract and Fiscal Law Department are excited to bring this course to the acquisition law community. We look forward to seeing you in August.
