COURSE DESCRIPTION

This survey course is designed to acquaint senior U.S. Army Reserve and Army National Guard officers with the legal responsibilities and issues they will encounter. Administrative and civil law topics include standards of conduct, administrative separation boards, labor-management relations, administrative investigations, deployment claims, financial liability investigations, survivor benefits, mobilization legal assistance, post-mobilization family support, environmental law, government information practices, equal opportunity issues, Uniform Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA), Service members Civil Relief Act, and adverse administrative actions for Reserve Component Soldiers. Criminal law topics include search and seizure, confessions, non-judicial punishment, administrative separations, improper senior- subordinate relationships and fraternization, and command influence. Emphasis is placed on the options and responsibilities of convening authorities in military justice matters, including theories and effects of sentencing. International and operational law topics include law of war and national implementing policy, status of forces agreements and other stationing agreements, military support and aid to civil authorities, and rules of engagement. Contract and fiscal law topics include an overview of fiscal law with an emphasis on current issues affecting commanders; funding issues for military operations; deployment contracting; procurement fraud overview, and competitive sourcing and privatization updates.
